The ideal candidate will possess a passion for both music and drama, as well as an understanding of Jewish music and culture. This role involves teaching music and drama classes, as well as leading services as needed. The candidate must be an enthusiastic team player committed to fostering a positive, inclusive, and engaging learning environment for students.

Key Responsibilities

- Teach music and drama classes for K-8 students, creating an engaging and inclusive curriculum that inspires creativity and self-expression.
- Lead or assist with Jewish music, prayers, and services for the school community as needed.
