


St. Louis' ONLY Pluralistic Jewish Day School





Our families represent all denominations. They are Jews by choice and Jews by birth, Ashkenazi, Sephardi and Mizrachi.






Acampaign to break down the barriers






- \$2 million to endow support services

Barrier #1. Affordabily






- Jewish leaders of the future do not all come from families who can afford full tuition.
- Mirowitz is committed to making Jewish day school available to a diverse community of families and to offering tuition assistance to those with a demonstrated need.

► Tuition: \$17,500

Cost to educate each child: \$19,000



Who is impacted by affordability?





- **▶ 68%:** Mirowitz families who receive a tuition discount
- > \$1 million: scholarship dollars awarded annually
- > \$10,000: Average scholarship award
- Every year, interested families do not enroll (or re-enroll) for financial reasons. This includes Jewish communal professionals who dedicate their lives to the community but feel they cannot afford Jewish day school.

Why this campaign matters:



The interest from a \$2 Million Endowment will enable us to sustain scholarships for the 20-21 Kindergarten class through their tenure at Mirowitz.











Why it matters?

Landscape of Support Services



The challenge: support services are expensive!





Our Learning Support Program began with a 2-year \$100K seed grant.

WHAT WE SAID WE WOULD DO:

- Impact 25 students
- Support 10 new students
- Increase support time for 15 students
- Accept and retain students who otherwise would not thrive
- Supported students would demonstrate progress
- Create plan for self-sustainability

WHAT WE DID:

- Impacted 30 students
- Supported 15 new students
- Increased support time for 25 students
- Accepted 6; retained 16
- 100% of students



- With the exception of schools created to serve special needs, no other St. Louis independent school offers this level of support.
- Typically, independent schools outsource support services at the parents' expense.
- Historically, families needing support would not consider Mirowitz because they believed there would be an increased financial burden. We provide services without adding to a family's tuition.
- Each year, parents inquire about transferring their children to Mirowitz because they are failing to thrive elsewhere. We are able to admit those whose learning needs are within the scope of our program and who will be successful at Mirowitz.

An unacceptable reality:

A survey of the American Jewish community found that people with disabilities are underrepresented among those engaged in Jewish life. The results indicated that most people with disabilities opt out of Jewish life after feeling alienated by day schools, camps and synagogues.


How we measure success:

- Students are "graduating" from support services.
- We can accommodate children we used to "coach out" of Mirowitz due to lack of expertise and/or human resources.
- For the past three years, 100% of Mirowitz students (including careteam students) are accepted into their first-choice secondary school.
- For the past 5 years, Mirowitz 8th graders (including care-team students) have exceeded public and private school norms on standardized test.



How we measure success





- Mirowitz 8th grade students (blue) tested include students who have learning disabilities and receive support services.
- We do not "teach to the test," but rather use the results to determine where an additional grammar lesson or reading comprehension strategy might be helpful.

Why this campaign matters:







A \$2 MILLION LEARNING SUPPORT ENDOWMENT will spin off an income to replace 80% of the seed money and allow Mirowitz to continue serving diverse learners.*

"We moved to St. Louis last summer, and wanted to enroll our boys in a Jewish day school. But each had some challenges, and we needed a school that could attend to their needs. Mirowitz's care team took them under its wing, offering one support in writing and reading, and the other socialemotional support. They have both grown tremendously this school year!
